Thirdly, my dear superior, Mission Bishop Roland Gustafsson, for the sake of honesty I have to tell you of a third issue, that you should take into account when thinking of me as your employee. In Finland it is widely recognized that whenever someone from the Province of Savo stands up to say something, the responsibility is transferred to the listener.

Your honour, Mission Bishop Roland Gustafsson, due to your challenging task as a superior, I will promise to pray daily for you, so that you might receive heavenly wisdom and strength in the implementation of your demanding ministry.

Dear friends, you do understand that I cannot say "Amen" in the end of the egocentric words like these. Therefore I finish just like movies during my childhood: "the end".
